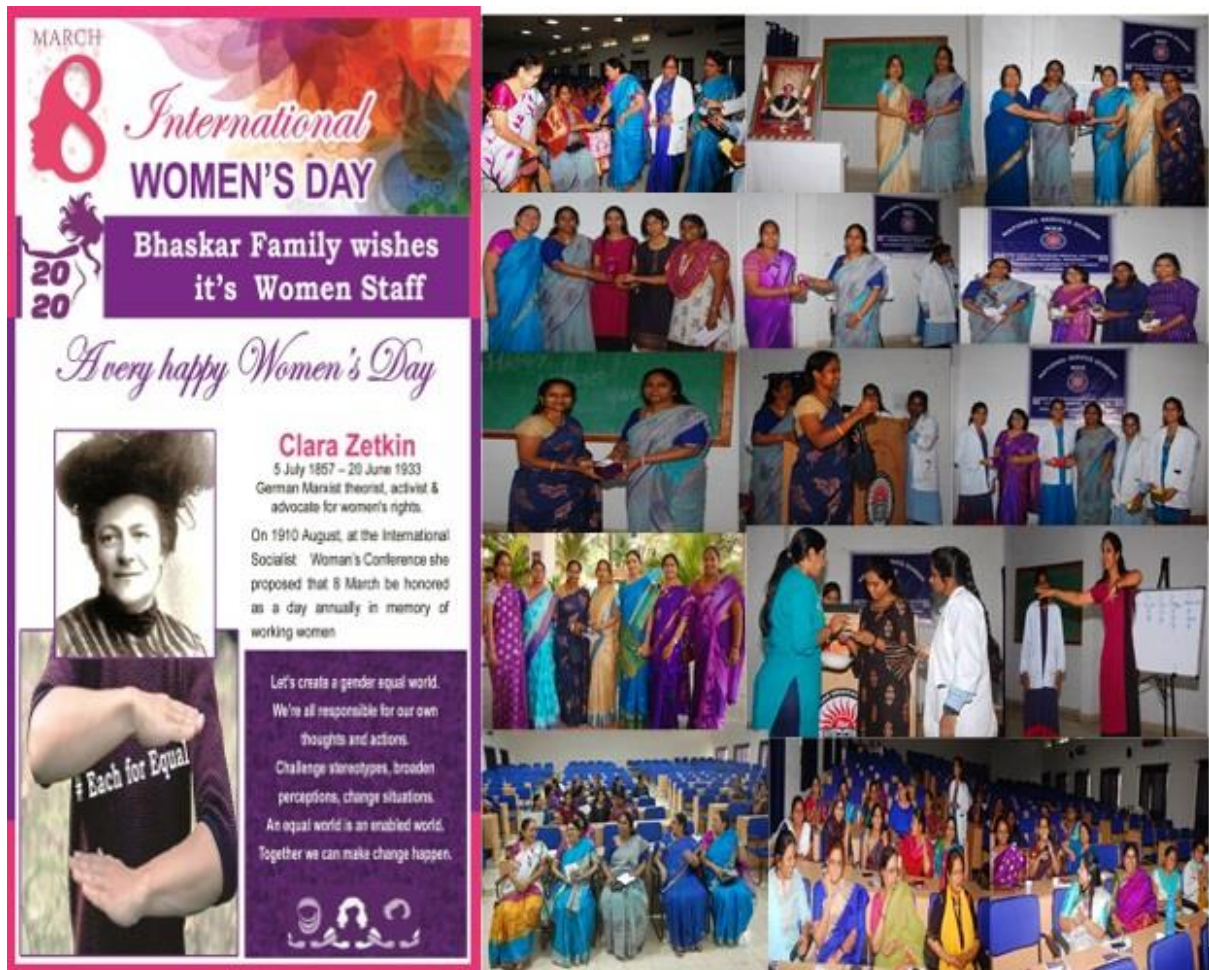


## International Women's Day: 8th March 2020.

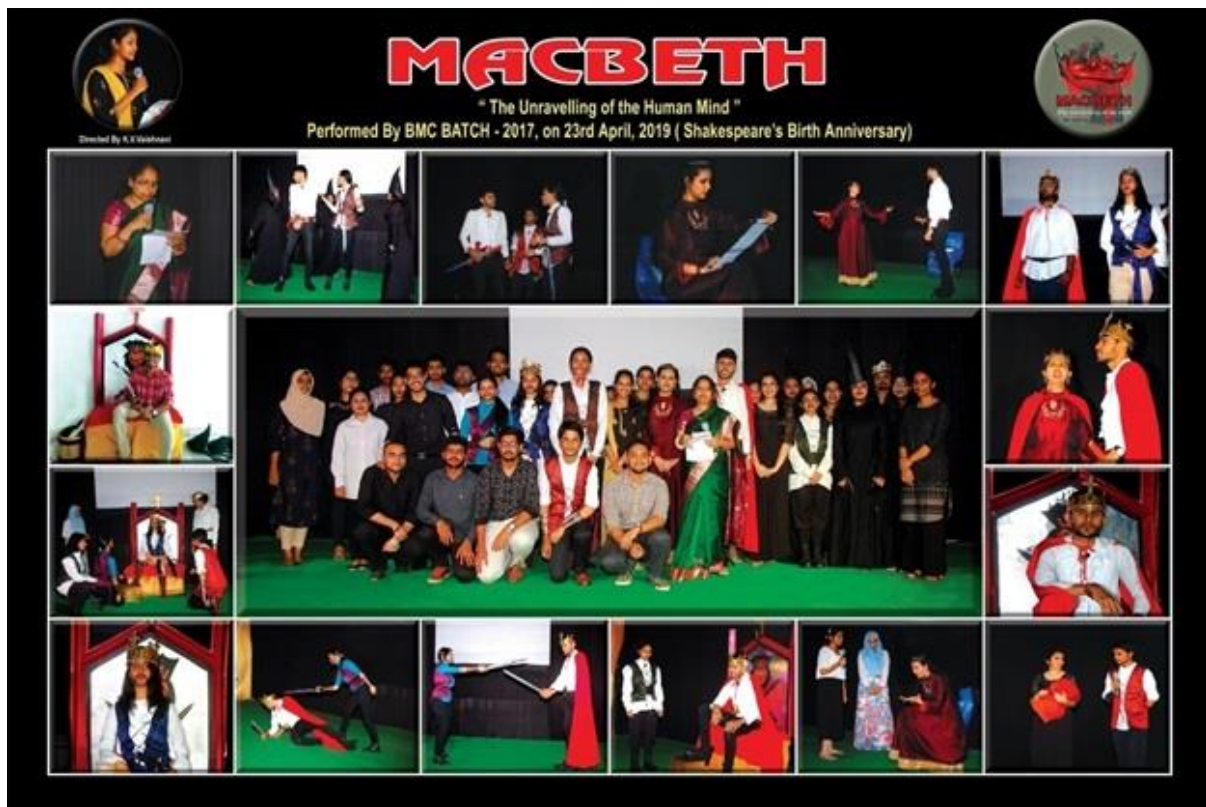
