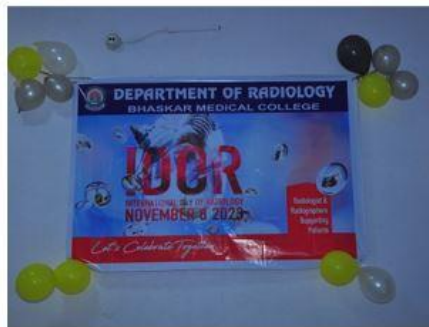

## Anti-Ragging Day Week: 18th August 2023

Anti-Ragging Day and Week, a crucial observance that underscores our commitment to fostering a safe and nurturing environment within our educational institution. Ragging, a practice that once may have been viewed lightly, has now rightfully evolved into an unacceptable and reprehensible act.

In the context of medical colleges, preventing ragging is not only a moral imperative but a critical step towards nurturing future healthcare professionals who embody compassion, ethics, and empathy. To ensure a ragging-free environment, we must adopt a multi-faceted approach that encompasses education, awareness, and robust enforcement.

### **Strategies to Reduce Ragging:**

#### **1. Sensitization Programs:**

- Organize workshops and seminars on the psychological and emotional impact of ragging, encouraging empathy among students.
- Invite experts to discuss the legal implications of ragging, raising awareness about the serious consequences perpetrators may face.

#### **2. Mentorship Programs:**

- Implement a mentorship system where senior students are assigned as mentors to guide and support newcomers, reducing the chances of isolation and victimization.
- Encourage mentor-mentee interactions through regular meetings and open communication channels.

#### **3. Establishing Clear Policies:**

- Develop comprehensive anti-ragging policies that clearly define prohibited activities and outline disciplinary measures for violators.
- Ensure that students and faculty members are well-informed about the policies and consequences of ragging.

#### **4. Anonymous Reporting Mechanisms:**

- Create anonymous reporting platforms, such as hotlines or online forms, for students to report instances of ragging without fear of retaliation.
- Establish a dedicated committee to handle and investigate reported cases promptly and confidentially.

#### **5. Strengthening Counseling Services:**

- Enhance psychological and counseling services on campus to provide support to victims and potential perpetrators.
- Raise awareness about the availability of counseling resources and reduce the stigma associated with seeking help.

#### **6. Collaborative Initiatives:**

- Collaborate with local law enforcement agencies to ensure the enforcement of anti-ragging laws and regulations.
- Partner with non-governmental organizations (NGOs) working against ragging to leverage their expertise and resources.

### 3D Learning of Anatomy of Bhaskar Medical College students at IIIT Hyderabad–2nd June 2023

Lecture on brainstem was taken to 1<sup>st</sup> MBBS students with pre and post tests (before and after lecture) on 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2023. Students were taken to IIIT HYDERABAD to experience 3D learning of NEUROANATOMY.

Two groups were selected randomly -1 group for 2D -conventional method of learning and another group for 3D method of learning using software developed by IIIT HYDERABAD.

Pre and post tests were conducted for both the groups. It was overall great innovative learnings for the students and for faculty too.
